Jesus' Glory was revealed through...

His <u>obedience</u> (v. 4)

"We see the glory of an obedient Son. Part of Jesus' glory is His radical freedom from family partiality and His radical allegiance to His Father in heaven. "We have seen His glory, glory of the only <u>Son</u> from the Father".

His capacity to <u>Create</u> (vv. 7-9)

Jesus' Glory was revealed through...

His <u>generous</u> <u>provision</u> of <u>abundant</u> <u>better-ness</u> (v. 6)

This simple story is the first of seven signs that John gives us. Showing us the glory of Jesus. Pointing us to the glory of the cross & resurrection.
