## One Thing

just miss the one  
thing—we miss  
everything!”**

Way back in 1991, I watched a movie called “City Slickers.” It starred Billy Crystal as the character Mitch and an old cowboy named Curly, played by the actor Jack Palance. The story-line is that every year, three friends would take a vacation away from their wives and big-city jobs. This particular year, these three men decided to reignite their masculinity by taking a supervised cattle drive across the American Southwest. Under the supervision of gruff cowboy Curly (Palance), the men set out on a journey across the plains.

At one point along the journey, Mitch and Curly are riding their horses side by side and Curly asks Mitch if he knows what the secret of life is. Curly then holds up his gloved right index finger and says that the secret of life is “one thing.” Mitch says, “That’s great, but what’s the one thing?” To which Curly says, “That’s what you’ve got to figure out.”

This past year we’ve been working our way, verse by verse, through the New Testament books of 1st and 2nd Peter. These two letters were written by the Apostle Peter in the months preceding his death in Rome as part of the horrific persecution of Christians by Emperor Nero. Peter wants everyone who reads his letters (including us!) to understand that following Christ is never going to be easy. In fact, it

will inevitably involve suffering and persecution. We have an enemy in this world by the name of Satan who is working tirelessly to thwart the work of God. Peter calls us to keep a humble heart and stand strong in our faith.

At the beginning of 2nd Peter, written perhaps weeks prior to his death, Peter zeroes in on his “one thing.” He knows that he is about to die (see 2 Peter 1:14) and is using this letter

to “make every effort to see that after his departure we will always be able to remember these things” (2 Peter 1:15). When Peter says “these things,” he is really talking about “one thing.” That one thing is Jesus.

**Whatever we do, Peter says, we must NEVER take our eyes off of Jesus!**

Peter knows full well that, after he dies, many people will come along and do everything they can to distract us from Jesus. More than that, they will try to make us doubt what the Scriptures tell us about Jesus. Because, if we begin to doubt what the Bible says, we doubt the very foundation and basis of our faith.

So Peter shouts from the core of his being, **“You can believe everything I am telling you about Jesus!”** He says that he and the other apostles “did not follow cleverly devised stories when they told us about the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ in power, but they were eyewitnesses of His majesty” (2 Peter 1:16). Peter goes on to describe the time that he, James and John went up to the top of a mountain with Jesus—and right before their very eyes Jesus was transfigured into the glorious person that He was in heaven before He even came to this earth. His face changed and His clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning (Luke 9:29). And

a voice boomed from heaven saying, **“This is my Son, whom I love; with Him I am well pleased.”**

If this happened right before your very eyes, wouldn’t this be your “one thing” for the rest of your life? Peter is pleading with us to believe him. He’s warning us not to get distracted or doubtful. And he backs up his testimony with even greater evidence—the entire Old Testament!

In 2 Peter 1:19, Peter says, “We also have the prophetic message as something completely reliable, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.” The “prophetic message” he’s referring to here is the Old Testament. And the morning star is Jesus.

Moses pointed to Jesus fifteen hundred years before Jesus came to earth. David pointed to Jesus a thousand years before Jesus came to earth. Isaiah pointed to Jesus in FANTASTIC DETAIL seven hundred years before He came to earth (see Isaiah 52-53). Hundreds of very specific prophecies were written about Jesus before He ever appeared. “Above all,” Peter says, “you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet’s own interpretation of things. For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God, as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit” (2 Peter 1:20-21).

Peter is talking to each one of us. He’s holding up his index finger and he’s saying that the secret to life is one thing and that one thing is JESUS! Jesus is the Son of God. He is the Savior of the world. He is the Majestic One who is full of glory and is in control of all things. We can believe EVERY WORD that the Bible says about Him. We MUST believe every word the Bible says about Him. If we miss Jesus, we don’t just miss the one thing. We miss everything! Salvation is found in no other name but the name of Jesus!

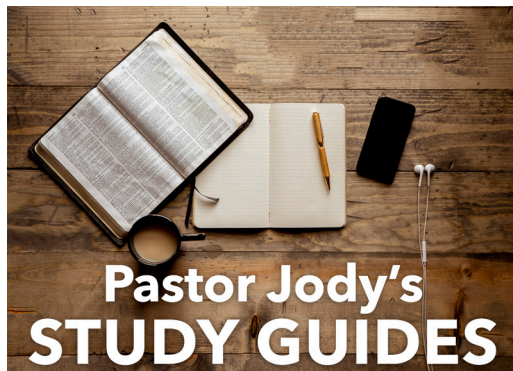

# Board of Administration Meeting Highlights

The Board of Administration met on Wednesday, June 12, 2019, in the Administrative Office Conference Room. Chairman Glenn Watson called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Alexander Rosenbaum opened the meeting with devotions. Following are highlights from this meeting:

## Senior Pastor's Update:

Pastor Jody gave kudos to our seven summer interns who are serving at King Street and thanked God for them. He shared that Don and Ann Baker are meeting with them regularly to assist in deepening their prayer life. Bless Week had over 500 volunteers involved. Putting together meals for the Hunger Project was a wonderful addition. Don is leading the creation process for a booklet that explains the reasons behind our church's 10 year vision statement so that people understand and buy-in more confidently. The formation of L3 groups is in process. A meeting will be held June 23 with Sunday school leaders to discuss their importance. Pastor Jody spoke briefly about becoming a part of "The Exponential Group," involving eight UB pastors and 16 pastors from other denominations. The group is led by UB Pastor Andy Secora from Cleveland and will focus on discussions revolving around church planting and multiplication, both on the local level and internationally.

## Executive Pastor's Update:

Don Baker shared that staff evaluations are under way. He encouraged the board to pray for the UB National Conference being held in July. Our church picnic will be held at Norlo Park at 4 p.m. on September 1. He shared some thoughts about Ephesians, chapter 6—putting on the armor of God. Prayers are requested for Celebrate Recovery as spiritual warfare is

prevalent; Satan is attacking. A prayer team is praying through the building on Tuesday, June 18. Seven child dedications will be held on Father's Day. Praise God!

## Elder Team Update

Greg West confirmed that Justin Sollenberger and Rex Black have been affirmed as members of the Elder Team at all levels and brought these men to the board for affirmation. A silent vote was held with eleven voters—all affirmative for both men. There will be a laying on of hands ceremony in front of the congregation to confirm. The Elder Team now has seven members: Gary Piper, Glenn Watson, Justin Sollenberger, Rex Black, Jody Bowser, Don Baker and Greg West.

## Co-Mission Reports:

- **Adult Ministries** – Mark Willson shared that the co-mission will be involved with the June 23 introduction of L3 groups to the Sunday school leaders.

- **Children's Ministry** – Alexander Rosenbaum asked for prayer for Lisa Todino's second knee surgery which will take place on July 1. As of the BOA meeting, 180 children were signed up for VBS; crew leaders are still needed. He thanks the staff for doing a great job in preparing for VBS. Kara Wiley, the children's ministry summer student intern, is a welcome addition to the team this summer.

- **Finance** – Student grant applications are in the foyers and online. Applications and grades are due by Monday, July 22. Bequest/Estates funds were received and will be distributed to the Local Outreach and General Missions funds as well as to our Endowment Fund. The next Finance meeting will be July 29.

- **Local Outreach** – Tom Knepper shared that the next quarterly meeting will be held the first Tuesday in August with between 13 and 17 partner ministries providing updates. All are invited to come and hear about the



blessings that are occurring. Kudos to Cheryl Young who led the Hunger Project meal prep.

• **Missions** – Scott Bert shared that the Gerlachs are going to be on home assignment for approximately six months in late June and have been told by TEAM (The Evangelical Alliance Mission) that they need to increase their monthly support. A Barnabas Team trip to Thailand in early 2020 is under consideration. The co-mission discussed Cornerstone Ministries in Malawi, a Christian program focused on education of Malawian youth. About 165 children attend and the teaching program includes farming skills, which helps to financially support the ministry. There is a financial need for the building of a library/science/computer lab. A motion to give a one-time gift to Cornerstone toward this new building carried.

• **Personnel Relations** – The co-mission met on June 10. Kim Shatzer shared that the beginning of the meeting was devoted to prayer for the staff. The staff picnic was held with about 100 people attending. It was a good evening of fellowship. The staff and PRC had a wonderful time getting to know each other. We still have the Food Service Coordinator position open and are waiting to see how the Lord moves regarding the filling of that position. At the time of the BOA meeting, there are two candidates for the Business Manager position. The search team will be interviewing. A motion to offer the part-time Director of Agape English Ministries position to Sue Marshall passed.

• **Property** – The Property Co-Mission met on June 3. Jim Goetz shared that Doug Gayman quoted the work to remodel the sanctuary front stage and a motion to accept was approved. Regarding the first floor hallway re-design, three of the four contractors contacted have been in touch with Ken; remodeling costs are expected by the end of June. The proposed parking lot at 18 North Second Street is still in the design stage, with an anticipated 33 parking spots.

New security cameras have been installed and are operational. The new parking lot restriction signs have been placed and seem to be making a difference. Numbers have been installed on the exterior doors and a footprint map of the building showing door numbers will be given to the Department of Emergency Services. Cost for campus signage at the corner of Main Street has been received and a motion to accept the low quote passed. The Property Co-mission discussed the need for upgrades and expansion of the small kitchen in the student ministry area.

• **Student Ministry** – The Student Ministry Co-Mission met on June 3. The team spent some time getting to know their student interns, Lauren and Izzy. Penny Poorman shared that they are excited to see how they will impact the ministry and the blessings that will be received. The Road Crew Picnic was held on May 15. Over 20 volunteers and their families enjoyed a fun-filled evening. June 9 was Gym Day. Middle school students were treated to lunch and played games in the gym. Students met at Rhodes Grove Camp and Camp Joy El as part of Bless Week. The interns will be leading four summer Street meetings. The Chambersburg Project is July 14–19; the Philadelphia Missions trip is July 28 – August 3.

• **Worship Arts** – The Worship Arts Co-Mission met on June 3 and prayed for Bless Week. Chuck Schussler shared that the card ministry has been well received and is continuing. The board spent considerable time discussing a proposal to upgrade the sanctuary center screen and projector. The upgrade would provide a center screen and projector which would allow sermon playback on the middle screen with sermon slides on the side, similar to the current screens that exist in the Baker Center. A motion to proceed with the upgrade was approved. Discussions are continuing regarding stage build-out and sanctuary lighting upgrades.

## Administrative Report:

Don Baker shared that Bless Week donations amounted to more than \$10,000.

## Vacation Bible School UPDATE

Our Vacation Bible School was greatly used by the Lord! We had about 175 men, women and teenagers who served more than 265 children in a variety of roles: leading crews, teaching, helping, serving on the praise teams, preparing food, running lights/sound, and in many other behind-the-scenes ways—buying snacks, decorating, stuffing bags, etc. You have no idea how much your help was appreciated! Please continue to pray with us that the children were able to receive the truth of God and will respond to the Holy Spirit's work in their lives.



## Once More Ministries Report

A Once More Ministries distribution was held on June 8. The attendance was slightly lower than average. We were blessed to serve 152 households for a total of 587 individuals. We shared the love of Jesus and the church with all who attended the distribution. Many of our guests asked for continued prayer for personal issues and we also prayed that they would accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

As this ministry continues, we ask that you keep the volunteers in prayer, that they may be refreshed and encouraged as they strive to help this ministry grow and serve the community.

Every distribution is a joy and we thank you for your continued support. To serve the community in such a significant way is a blessing to everyone.

If you would like to donate toiletries, there are tubs in the classrooms and bins in the lobbies where you can place items. Volunteers will collect all items and deliver them to our storeroom for the next distribution.

A huge pile of mulch (five yards) was waiting in the driveway. The men shoveled the mulch into wheel barrows and took their loads to at least a dozen different places where it was needed. The ladies, children and the men who weren't shoveling put on their gloves, grabbed their hand tools, got down on their knees and spread the hills of dumped mulch around all the bare spaces. I headed to the kitchen to get them some ice water. I looked at my watch; all the work had been completed in less than 90 minutes!

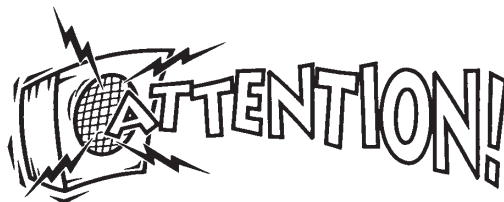

Bless Week is an annual outreach event that we host at King Street Church to provide opportunities for our church family to serve the community.

My favorite part of helping out with Bless Week was experiencing the ministry centers and seeing what daily life is like in a ministry setting.

The Hunger Project is an organization that packages meals for families who are not able to provide their families with food. Our church packaged 30,000 meals which will go out to families in the United States. It was great for me to witness the excitement in the room. Anytime a table was completed they would cheer and ring a bell. It was inspiring to see members of the church take time away from their Sunday to package meals for families.

During the week, Bless Week volunteers served at several organizations, all of which are ministry partners of King Street Church and serve the people of Chambersburg. Each ministry had their heart set on God. She's Somebody's Daughter is one of the organizations that has their focus on God and is driven to help women in human trafficking. Sweet Grace offers support to women who have endured miscarriage, stillbirth or neonatal death and provides a safe place for healing. Other ministries that were served through Bless Week include the Chambersburg Cold Weather Shelter, Habitat for Humanity of Franklin County, Network

Ministries, CROSS Inc, Joy El Camps and Retreats and Rhodes Grove Camp. Volunteers helped out by gardening, cleaning and organizing, completing construction projects, prayer and crafts.

I enjoyed taking photos of each place and capturing the ministries in motion. I loved seeing Network Ministries take place as they served teenagers and played games with them. The volunteers brought life to the teenagers and had fun along with them. Their joy encouraged me to just have fun even when I don't feel like it. I was also especially encouraged by how passionate the ministry directors are, such as Andrea Meredith of She's Somebody's Daughter. Andrea's eyes glow with passion. This inspired me to want to have more passion with the jobs that God gives me.

Volunteers spanned all ages from children to senior adults. It was an inspiration to see people from all walks of life who are committed to serving God. During Bless Week we used our talents to serve others in different areas. Some people served with physical labor and other volunteers chose crafts because they are more artistic. Each volunteer used their unique gifts and abilities to support the ministry organizations. God has equipped each of us with different gifts to help others!

Bless Week concluded with our community block party, Bless Fest. The "grand finale" of our week was another way to bless the community—this time with free food, games, face painting, a petting zoo, bounce houses and more. I was able to see how the church can bless the community. Volunteers took time out of their day to put others first, which is how Christians should be.

Some of the other interns and I passed out door hangers to people earlier in the week. I met people who I thought might not want to come to a church event, but later I saw those same people at Bless Fest and they were truly having a good time. I was blessed by seeing people come out of their comfort zones to have fun. I

enjoyed capturing the joy on people's faces and seeing people happy just by receiving free food.

We were able to bless those who may have not experienced anything like this before. I appreciate how King Street Church is willing to put other people first and willing to care more about people. Jesus walked this earth for a short period of time and blessed many people. We are challenged to do the same! I am encouraged to know that there are Christians

who are truly putting God at the center of their lives by serving others. Bless Week took a lot of coordination, planning and trust in God. I can see that God provided us with the capability to bless others and I am grateful for a church that truly cares for others. # JUST FOR KIDS

## PATRIOTIC PINWHEEL

Create this colorful July 4<sup>th</sup> craft.

### What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5" x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw



### What you do:

1. Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!

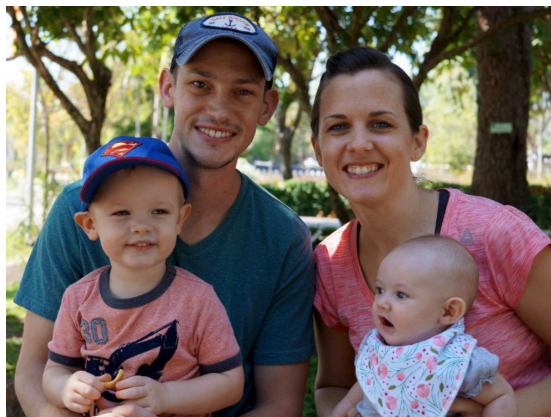
### **We are coming Home!**
