Finding Your Way Home

I can say with absolute confidence that we are NEVER so lost that we can't find our way home to God.

It's a story that sadly gets played out time after time after time. Words are spoken that can never be taken back. Tempers flare. Bridges are burned. Relationships are broken.

I'm not just talking about casual friendships or mere acquaintances. I'm talking about family. I'm talking about parents and children, brothers and sisters, husbands and wives. I'm talking about home.

Jesus told this story two thousand years ago. He spoke of a son, a father and a brother. He spoke of selfishness and short sightedness and hurtful words spoken in haste. He spoke about heartbreak, separation and arrogance. You can read it yourself in Luke 15.

The heart and moral of the story has far more to do with love than hate. It has far more to do with hope than disappointment. The sin and the selfishness is the human story, the lower story. The grace and reconciliation is the upper story. That's God's message, God's Word, to the world. It's Christmas. It's Jesus.

The world is full of prodigals—lonely prodigals, heartbroken and hopeless prodigals. Our community is full of prodigals. Fact is, you may be a prodigal. It might not be obvious on the outside. You may

not look the part. But deep down inside you know your own heart. If you slow down long enough to be brutally honest, you may well have to face the truth that, just like the younger son in Jesus' story, you've been on the treadmill long enough. All the things you thought would bring you fulfillment have turned out to be soap bubbles popping in your hand.

I don't know this for a fact, but I think there can actually come a point when, for some, home becomes a distant memory. When I say "home" here, I'm not talking about a house or a memorized address from our childhood. I'm talking about a place of peace deep within our soul—a place of warmth, safety and unconditional love. You try to remember the last time you felt completely loved just the way you are and you can't.

Is this you? Am I describing you?

If so, I have some really good news! You ARE loved—more than you know. God loves you so much that He sent His only Son to lay His life down for you. Trusting in Him not only opens the door to God's unlimited and unconditional forgiveness, but it opens the door to home.

It is NEVER too late to go home. Just ask the prodigal son in the Luke 15 story. That's when the story turns completely around. This is true in both an earthly sense, as well as a spiritual sense. I can say with absolute confidence that we are NEVER so lost that we can't find our way home to God. We read in Isaiah 59 that God's arm is never so short that He cannot save, nor His ear so deaf that He cannot hear. The Father's eyes are always scanning the horizon for us. His arms are open wide.

Christmas is all about Immanuel—God with us. It's the upper story of God's unfailing and never-ending love for us. Christmas is God coming all the way to us, so that He can bring us all the way back to Him. Christmas is *finding your way home*. The door is open ... the light is on ... the Father is waiting.

This summer, the Children's Ministry department met to discuss how our area of the church was living out the mission statement of the church, "To Engage and Bless our Community with the Gospel." It was during that discussion we felt

the need to talk through our children's ministry mission statement. We wanted to see how we could become more aligned with the church's over-arching mission and our ten-year vision for King Street Church.

The mission statement that we came up with is, "KSC Children's Ministry exists to connect children with God and others for a lifetime of following Jesus and serving their community."

We will accomplish this mission statement by:

- Providing an environment where children feel welcomed, safe and known.
- Teaching biblical truths and application to create a foundation in the Gospel.
- Providing opportunities for service and evangelism.
- Helping children learn about and encouraging them in their unique giftedness.
- Offering biblically based resources for parents to use as they guide their children.

This coming year, 2020, we will begin to make some minor adjustments to the programs we offer for the children on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings.

In SonShine Park, our preschool department, during our 11:00 hour on Sunday mornings, we will introduce a worship time for the children called Wee Worship. The purpose of

Wee Worship is to bring a larger group of preschool children together to review the morning lesson and to worship God together in song and motion. Our goal is to help the children experience and to begin to understand what a worship service is like (preschool style).

During the 11:00 hour in KidzTown, our elementary department, we will be offering elective classes for the children who have faith

questions or would like to go deeper in their faith journey. The classes will be offered periodically throughout the year and will last from four to eight weeks, depending on the topic. We are currently working on curriculum for these classes. We will be looking for adults who have a desire to see elementary children grow deeper in their faith by walking this journey with them and leading the classes. We will advertise when classes will be offered so families can plan for their children to be involved.

Some of the classes we will be offering are:

- What is a Christian? (for kids who are searching and have questions about faith in Christ)
- I'm a Christian Now! (for new believers)
- I Want to Get Baptized (starting in January 2020, kids who are interested in getting baptized will need to take this class to be part of church baptism)

Our elementary programming (grades 1-5) on Wednesday evenings, called KidzConnect, will start again on Wednesday, January 8. Doors will open at 6:45 in the Children's Ministry Center. On the first night back we will have a special event called Winter White Out. Kids can invite friends for an evening of games focused

on snow, fun and God's love for us.

Our goal for this coming year will be to encourage our church kids to invite their friends, who may not know who Jesus is, to come on Wednesday evenings so they can learn together about the things of God. We will be learning about who God is, who Jesus is, who

we are and how to respond to the Gospel. We want to encourage and help our elementary kids feel comfortable sharing their faith with their friends and peers who may be part of their lives through school, sports or the community they live in. We will also be inviting kids who are involved with other ministries within our church, such as our Agape English students and our After School Program friends.

The ministry staff is looking forward to helping our elementary kids see that God can use them where they are right now. They have a voice. If they are a follower of Jesus, they have something to share that can be life changing for another child. Our prayer is that God allows us to help facilitate what He wants to do in them.

Board of Administration Meeting Highlights

The Board of Administration met on Wednesday, October 9, 2019, in the Administrative Office Conference Room. Chairman Glenn Watson called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Mark Willson opened the meeting with devotions. Following are highlights from that meeting:

Senior Pastor's Update:

Pastor Jody shared his excitement about some of our ministries. CR just celebrated its foundational year. Many lives are being changed in the Agape English Program—thank you Sue Marshall. Some other ministries that are blessing and engaging include the After School program, Once More Ministries, Circles, Local Outreach, the basketball teams and many others. Pastor Jody is seeing signs that people are starting to live out the mission that is shared in the recently distributed booklet. Adam Keath is heading up a task force for "Parking Lot to Partnership" to greet, assimilate and move people to partnership. He requested prayer for Rev. Paul Baker who is recovering at Penn Hall.

Executive Pastor's Update:

Don Baker spoke of Dan and Heather Adamson and how they are witnessing through tragedy. He expressed thanks to the deacons for their ministry at KSC. Four people entered into partnership on October 13. Chris Farley is manning a table at AppleFest on October 19. October 27 will be a Baptism Sunday. November 3 will be Child Dedications. November 17 is the Thanks & Praise Service at 4 p.m. December 8 is the Christmas Program at 4 and 6 p.m.

Board of Elders Update

Greg West shared that the elders met two weeks ago. A motion that a donation be made to the Bahamas to support Samaritan's Purse for hurricane relief was approved. This will be put out to the congregation to join in and contribute for two weeks on October 20 and 29.

Co-Mission Reports:

- Adult Ministries The L3 Leadership Training was discussed. Some L3 groups have formed and it is hoped that as Pastor Jody preaches about the L3 groups in November, more groups will form. Sunday school teacher support letters are being mailed and will be followed up with a personal contact by the end of October. A quarterly connection is planned.
- Children's Ministry The Family Campfire was held at Rhodes Grove on October 5. Good things about the evening were heard. The After School Program is resuming. A Kid's Ministry Christmas Party is being planned in-house and will have a Nativity theme. The Preschool Worship hour will begin on Sundays in January. Kid's Ministry will host a Red Cross babysitting training sometime in January. A Spring Daddy—Daughter Date Night is being planned. Bible school is also being discussed. There will be a shift in the Wednesday night Kid's Ministry program to broaden the reach into the downtown community, including the After School and Agape English children.
- Finance Dan Gehris and Ken Adams met with Merrill Lynch last week and reviewed the Endowment Fund and Generation Next Step Fund. The staff has been advised that their 2020 budget requests must be handed in by the end of this week. The contract for the organ upgrade has been signed and the work will be scheduled for the near future. Ken covered the September Financial Summary. The YTD income is below the budgeted amount. September expenses were slightly over budget. YTD weekly giving is running below budget. The next finance meeting will be on October 21 when the 2020 budget requests will be reviewed.
- **Local Outreach** Tom Knepper reported that the Local Outreach Co-Mission met on

- October 8. Bless Week was discussed. The meal food company presented us with a certificate, plaque and stickers as a thank you for working with them to provide meals. Tom presented the items to Glenn Watson. Budget allocations for benevolence were discussed.
- Missions Nate Powles submitted a support request for a long-term assignment working in college ministry with the Coalition for Christian Outreach (CCO) at Penn State Altoona. Bryan and Emily Gerlach are in the US through the end of 2019. They shared updates on their previous and new ministry roles and also some updates on Cool Shade of Life Church. An honorarium was approved for Emily Schoenleber. A non-commissioned trip support was approved for Katie Shank for a missions trip to the Dominican Republic through Wilson College.
- **Personnel Relations** Kim Shatzer reported that the co-mission is testing the idea of "digital meetings." The Performance Review process is being retooled. The staff Christmas luncheon has been planned.
- **Property** Jim Goetz reported the following agenda items. The Land Use Permit for the signage at Main and King Streets is back and has been sent to Baer Sign. The heating system replacement in the Education Wing—work is ongoing to replace the boiler with various heating sources. All utilities at 18 North Second Street have been disconnected and service to the Graham Building has been rerouted. Fencing has been installed. We have 18 trees that need to be trimmed and some that need fertilized.
- **Student Ministry** Penny Poorman noted that a Youth Ministry Simulcast Training was held on September 21 with 94 attendees (some from other churches). Basketball is starting with the first open gym. On October 25 a Totally 80's All Nighter will be held. Wyatt Stevens, a Road Crew member, will be sharing his story.


In November, the co-mission will be discussing more tangible ways to engage and bless.

• Worship Arts – The carillon repair was discussed. Don Moen will be giving a concert at 6 p.m. on October 27. The encouragement cards project continues. Chuck Schussler and Steve Flint led a discussion on the proposal for sanctuary repair and updates to house lights, projectors and motorized blinds. Steve Flint requested prayer for special events and worship leaders.

Administrative Report:

A motion to donate to the First Responder Appreciation Day, which is sponsored by the Greater Chambersburg Chamber of Commerce carried. The Core Team has looked over a proposal to change our web streaming service provider.

An Introduction

L3 Groups grew out of our focus on a new 10 Year Vision, which is:

In the next ten years, King Street Church will create and establish clear and intentional pathways of discipleship development to equip the church for engaging and blessing our community with the Gospel. We will shift our emphasis to become a church family where everyone is purposefully using their spiritual gifts to live out God's call on their lives.

At its heart, our 10 Year Vision is a call to a deeper walk with Christ. We are convinced that the primary discipleship pathway for accomplishing our 10 Year Vision is L3 Groups.

L3 Groups are discipleship communities of 6-12 people who meet at least twice a month for the purpose of sharing life together in three ways: LOVING one another, LEARNING together and LAUNCHING ministry as we encourage one another in our spiritual gifts.

- Loving: In John 13:34-35 Jesus says, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples."
- **Learning**: In John 8:31-32 Jesus says, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my

disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

• Launching: In John 20:21 Jesus says, "As the Father has sent me, I send you."

We clearly discern the call of Jesus to His followers to give priority to building community, growing together and spurring one another on toward love and good deeds. To live out this vision at King Street Church, we commit to active participation in an L3 Group.

Make some Christmas candles to remember Jesus, the Light of the world.




What you need:

CROSS operates three care homes for 12 on community donations for 40% of their budget. 

The Crisis in Haiti

Brought Together by God

In 2012 under the direction of the leadership of King Street Church, we began a relationship with the United Brethren Church of Arcahaie. They are one of 18 United Brethren in Christ churches in Haiti. In the past seven years this fruitful partnership has produced a new church, a water depot and a school. The school has grown from 80 students to 259 students with grades from preschool through the ninth grade. King Street Church families sponsor 103 students in Haiti, a nursing student and a student in theology school. There is a full picture display of the numerous accomplishments that have been completed in the hallway between the sanctuary and the Rotz foyer. We invite you to take a few minutes to become familiar with the work that the Haiti Barnabas Team and our Haitian partners have accomplished. It is truly a work of the Lord. As Pastor Massillon has said many times, "Only God could bring a team from Pennsylvania and Haiti together as brothers and sisters and work so well together."

With the construction completed in Arcahaie, the King Street Barnabas Team has been fulfilling the pastors' request for teaching and training. Haitian teachers do not receive formal training. A team of King Street teachers has been working with the teachers at the school to provide "solid instruction techniques" as well as teaching skills specific to each grade. Our teams have also conducted health, family and

leadership seminars. Last November eye exams were done for every student in the school. We have enjoyed visiting Haiti two to three times each year and were scheduled to conduct adult eye exams this fall. We have also begun exploring the possibility of beginning a new partnership in Laurent with Pastor Senel. In fact we have already helped him replace the roof of his church which was damaged in the hurricane. A plan was also coming together to sponsor students in technical trades.

Desperate Situation

However, in 2019 we have not been able to send a team to Haiti because of the political unrest and protest. The crisis in Haiti is so severe that schools were not able to open in September and are still not open. Most businesses are either closed or open very little. Many of the roads are blocked; gasoline, food, medical services and medicine are in short supply. The cost of rice has doubled and corn meal has tripled; inflation is out of control. It is difficult for us to imagine it, but millions of people are literally on the brink of starvation.

In an article published in the New York Times (Kirk Semple, 10/20/2019), the author quotes a local as saying, "There is no hope in this country ... there's no life anymore." Fortunately, our brothers and sisters in Haiti find their hope in the Lord. Even so, they are struggling. I would like to share with you just a few of the comments I have received from some of our partners.

- 1. Ludlene oversees the Child Sponsorship Program. She says, "Unfortunately my family and I cannot go outside because of roadblocks and it's unsafe—they rob and rape so we stay at home. Sometimes they give you a day without protest, so on those days my father takes the opportunity to buy some food and medicine. It's difficult for me to find my medicine and I am suffering." Ludlene has a tumor near her brain that is not cancer, but requires medication.
- 2. Kim from Mission of Grace reports, "It's unsafe and the schools have not been able to start. Finding food is an on-going project and the costs have more than doubled." She has a child who needed to see a doctor and it took several days to find enough gasoline to make the trip.
- 3. Pastor Massillon, U.B. Church in Arcahaie, reported, "Arcahaie is locked down, as are most major cities." He is feeding the children every Saturday, but there is a great need for basic necessities like food, water, medicine and medical assistance. He says "I want to cry out to all my friends in the U.S. because I am in

need for so many things now, especially food."

4. Pastor Senel from the U.B. Church in Laurent has expressed concerns because thieves are now breaking into private houses and churches and law enforcement is so weak. He requested funds to close in the end of the church to ensure security. The Missions Co-Mission here at King Street sent him the funds to do so. Pastor Senel says "Hope is the word that means so much to us, the Haitian people. We learn to stay strong and be resilient through prayer and through our faith in our Heavenly Father. King Street brings the Good News which is the Word of God, and King Street brings hope from the smaller things you do, like feeding the little ones, to the greatest things you have ever done, which is changing lives throughout the world with the Word of God."

5. Michel works for CH Global and serves as our interpreter and our primary source of communication. He has echoed all the comments above and states that he does not see a quick resolution to the political unrest and protest. Many hospitals have closed or have limited services because of fuel shortages to run their generators. One hospital with a morgue is not fit to be used.

CH Global's staff has been able to distribute the sponsorship funds to 75-80% of the child sponsorship families. The ones that have not received their funds will receive their funding as soon as it is safe to travel to their locations. The teachers at the Arcahaie school have been receiving one half of their monthly salary during the school closure, which is great news because we have an investment in training those teachers and would like to sustain them during the crisis.

A Call to Prayer

The unrest and protest could not have come at a worse time. Rick Sanders and I attended the Haiti Annual Conference and were very excited to hear their plans for the future. This past August the Haiti Mission Field took the first steps to become a United Brethren Conference. They had their first election, selected a leadership team and began working on a Constitution. Pastor Supreme was elected as President, Pastor Massillon as Vice-President and Pastor Senel as a member of the Leadership Team. They had great plans to begin a training program for the Haitian pastors, develop a conference-wide Sunday school program and enforce new leadership standards.

At this time the Haiti Barnabas Team would ask the King Street congregation to support the children and our partners in Haiti with your prayers. I would encourage the KSC family to call your representatives in Congress and the White House to express your concerns and ask, "What are we doing about the humanitarian crisis in Haiti?" The United Brethren in Christ denomination has 18 churches in Haiti and I am sure each one covets your prayers. We have canceled three work trips in Haiti this year, but are praying and looking forward to what God has in store for 2020.
