Together Again

"For many years here at King Street, we have been talking about the need for more gathering space."

I was meeting with a couple several weeks ago. During the meeting, the woman described for me her history with King Street Church. She told me that she began attending King Street as a child—but stopped coming for a significant period of time during her late teens and twenties. Several years ago, through the invitation of a friend, she came back to church and began attending regularly once again.

She went on to recount that on one of the first weeks that she was back in church, I (Pastor Jody) gave an invitation for anyone who sensed the Lord speaking to their heart in some specific way to come down to the front during the closing worship song—and I would simply like to give them a hug to celebrate with them whatever decision they were making. It was a joy to hear this woman describe how she had done that and how the Lord has continued to work in her heart.

What really struck me about that memory, though, was the fact that there was a "once upon a time" when I invited people to come down front FOR A HUG! Can you imagine? Talk about a long time ago in a place far, far away! It almost seems like a fairy tale that we were able to have that kind of personal interaction—without fear of spreading a virus. It's crazy to think how this past year has changed all of that.

I hope you're like me in dreaming of a day when we will once again have this kind of connection and interaction with each other. Sure, I

believe that we will continue with some of the positive and common sense practices such as washing our hands far more often, staying at home if we're feeling ill or "sense something coming on," and the deep cleaning of shared surfaces. However, I am so looking forward to the time when so many of the protocols that we've put into place to stem the spread of this virus will no longer be needed.

It is with this in mind that I write this article.

For many years here at King Street, we have been talking about the need for more gathering space. The Lord has certainly blessed us with excellent facilities. We love our sanctuary and are so thankful that twenty years ago or so there was the foresight to construct our Baker Center. It has been so good these past few months to see kids, students and adults returning to spaces that for many years have been teeming with activity.

There have been several things, though, that our facility has lacked. We need additional restroom space, particularly for our women. We lack a more centralized entrance, which would be such a huge help in connecting with others in our church family, especially those who worship in the space that we're not in. It would be a real blessing to have a covered drop-off as we enter and exit the building, which would be so very welcomed especially in poor weather. Wheelchair accessibility is a real issue as it can be quite difficult to navigate the various floors and levels in our building. Our lobby and gathering spaces are woefully small. There simply isn't adequate space to linger and carry on a conversation. We do our best and make do, but the reality is that very little time is spent catching up with others as we come and go.

With all of this in mind, our Board of Administration recently voted to approve moving forward with the creation of a set of architectural drawings for a new 5,000 square foot Gathering Space addition that would connect our current Baker Center entrance

with the Rotz Foyer entrance. This would be a spacious two-story gathering area, creating a natural flow both to our Sanctuary as well as our Baker Center. It would possibly include a covered drop-off area for vehicles, a covered walkway along the back of the Sanctuary for pedestrian traffic, new restrooms, inviting seating areas, a welcome center and space for coffee and refreshments.

The obvious and immediate question that all of this poses is: Why are we talking about this in the midst of a global pandemic, when our average weekly attendance is basically half of what it was a year ago?

I have several answers to that question. First, I don't think ANY OF US want things to remain where they are right now. I know it will take some time, but I truly hope and pray that most of those who are engaging with us online will return to gathering in-person as health and safety concerns allow. Secondly, I believe that now might be an excellent time to go through the pains of construction—while our numbers are down a bit. Thirdly, we have funds set aside for this very purpose. Fourth, this project addresses all of the needs that I previously mentioned.

To be clear, the decision has been made to move forward with architectural drawings. Those drawings should be completed by late March or April. As those drawings are completed, we will make them available to be viewed by the larger church body. The decision will then be made as to whether we move forward with construction. We value your prayers as we diligently seek the Lord's will with this project.

Board of Administration Meeting Highlights

The Board of Administration met on Wednesday, December 9, 2020 in the KSC Choir Room. Chairman Glenn Watson called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Jim Byers opened the meeting with devotions and prayer. Following are highlights from that meeting.

Gathering Space Cost Estimate Discussion:

Glenn Watson reviewed the current 40% Design Development Gathering Space plans. Gregg Thompson from Brechbill and Helman presented the Gathering Space cost estimates totaling \$2.1 million before value engineering savings. Gregg and Glenn discussed the value engineering options available to reduce the cost of the project. Depending on which and how many of the 29 value engineering options that are selected by the Board of Administration (BOA), the projected cost of the project will range between \$1.68 million and \$1.94 million. Gregg Thompson answered questions about the project. Extensive discussion took place.

A motion to approve funding to take the next steps of authorizing the architect to complete the project plans to 100% Construction Documents, submit a Land Development Plan to the Chambersburg Borough for approvals and recording and install the SMC portion of the sprinkler system passed. A motion to prepare drawings with add/deduct alternates included and for Brechbill and Helman to bring 100% pricing to the BOA in April 2021 based on the 100% Construction Documents with Add/Deduct Alternate pricing for select Value Engineering Items, to be reviewed before approval, passed.

Senior Pastor's Update:

Pastor Jody reviewed Monday morning's Core Team meeting. Jody wants to keep a mask optional service open, but with the COVID uptick right now, he is recommending that all

services be mask required until mid-January. Jody also advised that on December 27 the church building will be closed and a Christmas video will be streamed online. A motion to support Pastor Jody's plan for December 27 passed. Upcoming Dates: 12/12 June Brown Memorial services, 12/16 Country Creek Christmas 4:00-7:30 p.m., 12/24 Christmas Eve Services at 3 p.m., 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. with signups.

Executive Pastor's Update:

Pastor Don announced the new BOA lay delegates will be Ken Adams and Andrea Adams. The PRC lay delegates will be Eric Oyer, Jim Byers and Rodney Mose. A motion to accept these lay delegate appointments and all new co-mission members for 2021 carried unanimously.

Co-Mission Reports:

- **Children's Ministry** Alexander Rosenbaum shared that the Kidztown Crossing school program continues to provide classes with 31 students attending. A motion to continue to provide funding for the Kidztown Crossing School Program through the rest of this school year carried unanimously.
- Finance Dan Gehris handed out copies of the Financial Summary Report for November 2020 and a copy of his PowerPoint financial presentation. Dan asked everyone to refer to his handouts for his financial update for the sake of time. November undesignated giving was slightly under budget. November operating expenses came in slightly over budget.
- **Local Outreach** Tamy Cook reported that six financial gifts to local ministries were made.
- **Missions** Scott Bert requested funds from the Missions General Fund be given to Frontier Alliance International with a focus on the persecuted church. A motion on this request carried unanimously. A motion to give the KSC Christmas Eve offering to Open Doors International to support the persecuted church

in Syria carried unanimously.

• **Property** – Dale Forney gave a brief review of current projects.

The other co-missions had no action items.

Jim Byers closed the meeting with prayer at 10:25 p.m.


While our enemy's toolbox can seem full, we are not left without hope. Jesus offers us the cross and the community!

Each evening includes a service with LIVE worship, Bible teaching, testimonies and



At the beginning of the COVID pandemic, we at King Street Church wanted to be intentional about reaching out to our seniors. So, for several months, a team of 12 individuals regularly contacted those 80

years of age and older. I received positive comments and feedback from both those contacting, as well as those who were the recipients. However, when I had my heart attack and subsequent by-pass surgery, that stopped since I was not able to manage that project.

For many past years those who were homebound or shut-in were contacted monthly by individuals via visits, cards or telephone calls. After COVID came it was only by cards or phone calls. These individuals were referred to as "shut-in" persons. There were numerous individuals, including myself, who did not like referring to these individuals as "shut-ins." However, we had no other distinction. Since my return in Novem-

ber as your Minister of Pastoral Care, I have thought about reconnecting with those of you who are age 80 and above (I myself will be in that category in a few weeks).

Pastors Jody Bowser, Don Baker, Steve Flint and I, along with Molly Shull, have discussed this on several occasions. On Monday, January 18, we made the decision to discard the distinction "Shut-ins" and coin the name "Silver Saints" for everyone age 80 and above. This will include those who formerly were called "Shut-ins" as well as the larger group. By the way, the King Street Church family includes almost 200 persons who are age 80 and above!

Starting in February you will be contacted by someone either via mail or phone call just to let you know that we care for you. Please note that being designated as a Silver Saint does not mean that you are homebound or shut-in. Some of you may be highly active at home, in the community or at church. In this time of increased isolation during the pandemic, we just want to be intentional to say to our senior family members, "We love you and think that you are very important to God and to us!"

When the pandemic hit and we closed our doors, we became a church that was used to being gathered to worship, to being scattered in worship. We can now see that God has been working even when we haven't been

able to see it.

Last March we wanted to continue to remain connected as a church as we were scattered in our communities. King Street Church was prepared with past investments in video systems and over eight years of livestream experience that allowed us to quickly transition to online-only services. While this was a response to an urgent need, being online has also opened doors to new people to attend King Street. We have now welcomed people in person who first worshiped with us online.

The media team is often asked if we know how many worship online. While it is tricky to exactly say, we do have a pretty good idea. To measure our online reach our teams use the most conservative measure of online worshipers, unique IP. An IP is an address that identifies a device on the internet. Each household produces their own IP — almost

like a digital fingerprint — and on our end, we can see those addresses.

Nationally, churches find that on average there are between 2-4 people per a unique IP address. Our traditional worship service is streamed at 8:00 a.m. each Sunday and rebroadcast at 1:00 p.m. On average we have approximately 356 unique IPs or approximately 710 online worshippers each week. Our contemporary service is broadcast at 9:30 a.m. each Sunday and rebroadcast at 11:00 a.m. In 2020 we averaged 509 unique IPs or approximately 1017 online worshipers for our contemporary service. This

means that we estimate more than 1700 people watch our services online every week.

Our media team has continued to build tools that enhance home worship. This includes a new Roku app that provides an upgraded livestream and access to archived media. The Roku app allows rewatching of weekly services, sermons, special services, Pastor Jody's Mid-week Connection video and much more. To find the new app search "King Street Church – New" in the "Streaming Channels" search on Roku. We also have an enhanced Apple TV app that can be found in the app store on the Apple TV.

In-person fellowship and community is important, but we are grateful that we have technology that can help people stay connected even if they can't attend in person. While seating can be limited in a room, the online platform gives unlimited potential to our growth and reach. We look forward to seeing what God does in 2021!



- 1. Pour about 3 cups of boiling water into a bowl. Soak sticks in the water about 30 minutes.
- Remove sticks and slowly, gently bend them into a curve.
- 3. To maintain the shape, place curved sticks inside a glass cup overnight to dry completely.
- 4. Remove and decorate the bracelets, which make fun Valentine's Day gifts.



Jesus, I am Resting

Turning back, Nicoll could not helping exclaiming, 'How can you whistle, when our friends are in such danger!'

'Would you have me anxious and troubled?' was the long-remembered answer. 'That would not help them, and would certainly incapacitate me for my work. I have just to roll the burden on the Lord.'

Day and night that was his secret, 'just to roll the burden on the Lord'. Frequently those who were wakeful in the little house at Chinkiang might hear, at two or three o'clock in the morning, the soft refrain of that favourite hymn. Taylor had learned that, for him, only one life was possible – that of resting and rejoicing in the Lord under all circumstances, while He dealt with the difficulties inward and outward, great and small.

Excerpt from J. Hudson Taylor: God's Man in China

Update from Emily, January 6, 2021

Happy New Year! I hope you all are doing well and had a wonderful time celebrating Christmas and the start of 2021!

I wanted to update you on what my plans are looking like for 2021. I am so grateful to each of you for your constant support through prayer, finances and encouragement. There are not enough words to say how much I appreciate it and how blessed I am! THANK YOU!

Thank you for your prayers over the past couple of months as I have been seeking the Lord for direction for this coming year. As many of you know or have heard, my plan was to move back to New Zealand this month, after having finished my commitment to Circuit Riders in December. Due to covid and the closure of NZ's borders for the foreseeable future, I went back to the drawing board with the Lord to see what I should do.

I mentioned in a previous newsletter that

the Lord has really been reminding me of my heart and desire to work amongst unreached and unengaged people groups and nations. I haven't given a lot of detail in my monthly updates yet because things are still yet to be confirmed due to some delays because of covid. I'm waiting to not "officially" share more details with people until I actually have them, but wanted to keep each of you in the loop and ask for your continued prayers.

I have been in conversation with one of the members of a missions organization called Frontier Alliance International. Since its establishment in 2011, they have had teams living and working in strategic locations within the 10/40 window, working to reach the people who still have no witness of Jesus among them.

The really cool connection with FAI is that I first learned about them when I was living in New Zealand. The couple that founded FAI and a lot of the founding team members were all part of the same community I was in. I just arrived about three years after they all left, but I remember hearing a lot about them from my pastor and other friends in our community.

So I have submitted an application to an intensive with one of their teams on the ground overseas. Originally this intensive was supposed to start in February, but it had to be postponed until spring due to covid and they are still finalizing dates. All that to say, nothing is confirmed yet, this is just the little step I've taken so far and I'm currently waiting to hear back from their team.

Overall, my hope would be to go over and do this intensive come spring and from there stay on with FAI in a long term capacity. I would love your continued prayers for the right door in the right time to be opened, and that even with all the current complications with covid, the Lord would show us ways to continue moving forward!
