Come and See!

"You and I have been formed by God to fulfill a purpose in His plan for this world. This is our highest and best calling."

How many of you remember the old song "The Hokey Pokey"? I remember the song from my childhood, especially when I would go to the roller skating rink. At some point during the two or three hour skating session, the DJ would have everyone make a big circle in the middle of the rink and we would collectively "do the hokey pokey." This involved a progression of putting various parts of our bodies "in" and then "out"—until we ultimately "put our whole selves in" and "put our whole selves out." I remember the whole thing was a lot of fun and laughs, especially trying to do the entire dance on wheels.

This image of "putting our whole selves in" is an excellent metaphor when thinking about our lives and our calling. God has been abundantly clear with us in His Word that each of us has been created by God and placed on this earth for a very specific purpose—a purpose that God has specifically and specially designed for each and every one of us. We see this in Ephesians 2:10—"We are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." This isn't just a happy thought that we put on a poster along with a cute picture of a puppy dog. This is an eternal truth that ought to transform the way we live our lives and the way we think

The naturalistic view of this world is that somehow—in some inconceivable way—this intricately designed world just sort of evolved out of a primordial soup of nothingness. I guess that when you theoretically spread things out over billions and billions and trillions and trillions of years, you just come to accept that anything is possible if given enough time (or you get enough people to believe it). But that way

God calls us to fully invest ourselves.

of thinking still fails to account for the amazing design that we see in this world. You and I both know that things don't get better and more excellent over time. They break down and wear out. I believe this concept is well-stated in the Second Law of Thermodynamics.

So back to Ephesians 2 and the very purpose and design that God (the TRUE creator!) has in mind for each of us. You and I have been formed by God to fulfill a purpose in His plan for this world. This is our highest and best calling. It deserves everything that we have to offer. We are completely missing the mark if we ignore this reality—or even "dabble around the edges" halfheartedly of what this means for each of us.

God calls us to fully invest ourselves, to put our WHOLE self in to the work that He has created us to do. What is that purpose you might ask? Perfect question. I PROMISE you that if you honestly and diligently ask God that question, He will give you an answer. The answer might be one thing today and another thing five years from now. But there is an answer. What we must do is to SEEK it out. We have to put ourselves forward.

The place to begin isn't ability—it's availability. And the invitation is the same for us today as it was for the disciples two thousand years ago: Come and See!

July 2021 Board of Administration Meeting Highlights

The Board of Administration of King Street Church met on Tuesday, July 27, 2021 in the Choir Room. (*This board meeting was called to address a few personnel matters. The BOA does not usually meet during the month of July each year.*) Glenn Watson, Chairman of the Board of Administration, called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. and opened in prayer.

Co-Mission Reports:

• **Personnel Relations** — Kim Shatzer shared that Michaela Olson is resigning from her position as the **Kidztown Elementary Coordinator** effective September 30, 2021. Alexander Rosenbaum, Becky Hann and Kim Shatzer met to review and amend the Kidztown Elementary Coordinator job description. The revised job description was distributed to the BOA and then discussed. A motion that the revised Kidztown Elementary Coordinator job description be adopted and that we commence advertising for this full-time position carried unanimously.

Kim next spoke about the filling of the **Pastor** of Middle School Student Ministries position that was vacated by John Shadle. The Search Committee met to discuss a resume received from Robert Gunkelman, who for the past four years has served as pastor to the students at a church in Orlando, Florida. Rob and his family came to Chambersburg recently to visit King Street Church. Rob was able to meet several members of the church staff and Road Crew during his weekend visit. The Compensation Committee has developed a compensation package to offer Rob. On behalf of the PRC, a motion that we offer Robert J. B. Gunkelman the position of Pastor of Middle School Student Ministries carried unanimously.

Kim next spoke about the filling of the **Executive Pastor** position that will be vacated by

Don Baker, effective July 31, 2021. Kim shared with the BOA a timeline of all the meetings that took place with various members of KSC leadership from June 15–July 24 and an overview of how each of those meetings went. The Search Committee prayed earnestly during this entire time frame for God's leading in how we should move forward in light of Don's resignation.

In one of the meetings, the possibility of Steve Flint filling the Executive Pastor role came up and extensive discussions followed. After praying, Steve's sense of God's blessing on this move set wheels in motion for some organizational restructuring. On July 24 the PRC met, discussed Steve Flint for the Executive Pastor position and unanimously voted in favor of Steve filling that role.

Following discussion among the board members, a motion was made and passed unanimously to approve a new structure for KSC staff. The reorganization consists of staff reporting to Steve Flint as Executive Pastor, with the exception of Administrative Assistant and Minister of Pastoral Care who will report directly to Pastor Jody. Positions supporting Worship and Creative Arts will report to Nathan Hann. Positions supporting Outreach will report to Adam Keath. Positions supporting Facilities will report to Jay Brown.







- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

What you do:


- 1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
- 2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
- 3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):
 - **blue** = the Father
 - white = God's holiness
 - **gold** = God's kingdom
 - **green** = the earth
 - **yellow** = wheat (bread)
 - **red** = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
 - black = temptation
 - **orange** = God's power to deliver







Questes of the Week

"God is always speaking. The question is—are we listening?"





King Street Church Malawi Barnabas Team

The King Street Church Malawi Barnabas Team was established in 2020 under the umbrella of the Missions Commission. The team is dedicated to helping our Malawi based



ministry partners advance the Gospel through their established in-country programs. We recognize the independence of the Malawi based programs and exist to support them through prayer, the development of personal relationships and the allocation of resources as provided through the Missions Commission.

Malawi is a small landlocked country in Southern Africa sharing its borders with Mozambique, Zambia and Tanzania. It currently has a population of 19 million people which is expected to grow to 23 million by 2023, with 77% embracing Christianity. It is the third poorest country in the world with a GNP of just \$399 per year. Politically it is a stable country but hunger, economic development and education continue to present constant challenges. Currently we support the following ministries:



Cornerstone Ministries Salima, Malawi

Cornerstone Ministries was founded in 2012 by three graduates of the African Bible College and the Urban Promise International Leadership Program in Camden, NJ. They started with an after-school program to tutor children

in grades 4-7 and to provide them with the only stable meal they consumed each day. That program continues to this day serving nearly 300 community children. In 2016 they founded a Christian high school with 24 students which has now blossomed to over 224. Recently, with some help from the KSC Disciples Class, they completed a new science center and library. They have also initiated a Girls Empowerment

Program to help girls advance in a world where many are married between ages 14-16. Most recently they have started a goat farm to help sustain their meal program. The Executive Director, Danneck Faylina, participated in a KSC Men's Retreat facilitated by Pastor Don Baker and his friend Bruce Main of Urban Promise. He remains in active contact with team member Fred Ailes. Visit cornerstoneministriesmalawi.org for more information.



Namikango Mission Thondowe, Malawi

Garnett Limani, a Malawian preacher, reached out to eight Texas churches in 1950, through the editor of the Gospel Tidings Magazine, Pastor GB Shelburne, Jr. This interaction produced the sending of American mission-

aries to Malawi and the acquisition of the 90-acre Namikango Estate in 1961 for a base of operations that continues through today. Namikango's primary mission has and continues to be the training of current and future Malawian church leaders and workers. This training started through its Bible school and

related local church-based programs through its affiliation with 1000 Malawian churches. Currently, they are establishing a Discipleship Training Institute, much like a seminary, and are in the process of recruiting local students. Additionally, they operate a much needed medical and maternity clinic, a coffee farm and a village savings and loan program. A current missionary, Eric Gephart, has ties to KSC through team member Alyssa Heberlig. Visit namikango.org for more information.



Rays of Hope Ministries

Rays Of Hope Ministries, Blantrye, Malawi

Rays of Hope is a local faith-based organization that was founded by three young Malawians in 2009 in the capitol city, Blantyre. The primary focus of Rays of Hope is to respond to the educational challenges faced by the children

of Malawi. Their programs, which are Christian value based, operate on the principal: "Nurture a Child—Nourish a Nation." Rays of Hope operates an afterschool enrichment program in partnership with five primary schools tutoring and feeding 350 students each day, provides material support and training for 800 teachers in cooperation with the government of Malawi, provides 65,000 students with supplemental educational materials, facilitates a training

initiative for high school drop outs, provides loans for students to attend high school—which is not free in Malawi, provides funding for student related business development and hopes to develop future farming programs. The Executive Director, Willie Mapsuka, is a graduate of the Urban Promise leadership Institute in Camden, NJ and has ties to KSC through our team member Aaron Ott with


