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Isaiah 59:15-19

"The Lord looked and was displeased that there was no justice. He saw that there was no one, He was appalled that there was no one to intervene. So His own arm achieved salvation for Him, and His own righteousness sustained Him. He put on righteousness as His breastplate, and the helmet of salvation on His head. He will repay wrath to His enemies and retribution to His foes; He will repay the islands their due. From the west, people will fear the name of the Lord, and from the rising of the sun, they will revere His glory. For He will come like a pent-up flood that the breath of the Lord drives along."

I will rejoice over Jerusalem and take delight in my people; the sound of weeping and of crying will be heard in it no more.
