Making All Things New

"Regardless of your struggles in the past, a better day is ahead." Imagine you got a call from a telemarketer, and he told you he could make everything new in your life! How would you respond? If you're like me, your "skeptical meter" would jump to the far right on the dial. "Yeah, right," you might reply (if you were being kind). "No one could possibly do that!"

However—what if the Creator and King of the entire universe made you this amazing promise? That's a different story, isn't it? The truth of the matter is that God HAS made this promise. In Revelation 21:5, Jesus said, "Behold, I make all things new. Write this down because these words are true and faithful."

Wow ... what do you make of that? These aren't just empty words or hollow promises. Our Heavenly Father has given us His Word on this. He can transform our broken circumstances and give us a new beginning! In this same passage in Revelation 21, we're told that God will dwell with us (v. 3) and "will wipe away every tear from our eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away" (v. 4).

We serve a God of second chances and fresh starts. With His help,

we can turn the page on 2021 and every other previous year—making 2022 our best year ever. But how? Is it enough to make New Year's resolutions? If you're anything like me, the answer is no. It's never been enough to simply make a "resolution." Rarely do these resolutions even see the light of February. I want to encourage you to bring your New Year's resolutions to the Lord and ask for His strategies and His strength. Whether your goal is to lose weight ... get out of debt ... rekindle romance in your marriage ... or spend more time with your children—you can call upon God for His supernatural help!

Remember that you are not alone. If you need some kind of new beginning today, you're definitely not alone. We should find great comfort in the fact that the Bible tells numerous stories of people who received breakthroughs and turnarounds from God. I especially love the account of the Samaritan woman who had a life-changing encounter with Jesus while drawing water from a well in the town of Sychar (John 4:1-42).

Later in the story, we learn why this woman needed a turnaround. She had already been married five times and she now was living with a man who wasn't her husband. Yet despite her colorful past, she was about to meet someone who could turn things around and give her a wonderful new future. He could show her a kind of love that no mortal man could provide.

Sadly, because of her past choices, this woman was a social outcast. It's probably why she came to the well at midday when it would be so hot that no one else would be there. To her surprise, someone was sitting by the well when she arrived. Not a Samaritan, but a Jew. Not a woman, as normally would come to draw water, but a man. And He was *already there*, as if to await her arrival.

It was Jesus and **He met her right where she was.** He knew all about her shame and brokenness, just as He knows about yours and mine. He knew she was working to get water that would soon leave her thirsty again. He

saw behind her self-assured facade and knew she was hungry for spiritual truth. He knew she needed the kind of turnaround that only He could provide. Just as for this Samaritan woman, a new beginning is available to each of us today. It's time to forget the past and let the Lord fill your heart with a "new song" of praise for His salvation (Psalm 40:3).

One of the intriguing parts of the Samaritan woman's story is found when she told Jesus, "I know that Messiah is coming' (who is called Christ). 'When He comes, He will tell us all things" (John 4:25). This woman expected the Messiah to come someday. She could even envision a future day when the Messiah would "tell us all things." Yet she didn't recognize that her new beginning was at hand. There was no need to wait any longer. The long-awaited Messiah was standing right next to her! To the woman's amazement, Jesus told her, "I who speak to you am He" (v. 26).

There's an important lesson here. Perhaps you've gotten used to thinking that your turnaround would come at some distant time in the future, if it ever came at all. But Jesus the Messiah is not some faraway person. He's right there with you, just as He was for the Samaritan woman!

The woman from Samaria was personally transformed by her encounter with Jesus. However, the story doesn't end there. Her transformation caused a ripple effect that impacted countless other lives as well: "Many of the Samaritans of that city believed in Him because of the word of the woman who testified" (v. 39). This incredible impact was possible because a woman who had made so many mistakes along the way came face to face with Jesus. In the same way, God wants to set you free from any past frustrations this year, giving you a new life of fulfillment, fruitfulness and peace.

As we begin a new year, ask God to give you the breakthrough you've been longing for. You may not need the kind of forgiveness and restoration Jesus gave the woman at the well.

November 2021 Board of Administration Meeting Highlights

The Board of Administration met on Wednesday, November 10, 2021 in the KSC Choir Room. Chairman Glenn Watson called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Ken Adams opened the meeting with devotions and prayer. Following are highlights from that meeting.

Senior Pastor's Update:

Pastor Jody expressed appreciation for the hard work of the Nominating Committee. Eight children were dedicated on Sunday, November 7. Sunday morning in-person attendance has increased and on-line participation remains strong. Agape Ministry continues to grow. A discipleship group for men has recently started among the Agape attendees. The 2021 Advent theme will be, "Step into the Story." In January 2022, a new sermon series from Hebrews will begin with the theme "Jesus is Greater." Pastor Jody shared his objectives for the upcoming year.

Elder Team Update:

Greg West shared that the elders met during October and spent most of the meeting praying for members of the congregation. They also discussed the future direction of the church as described in Pastor Jody's objectives.

Co-Mission Reports:


- **Children's Ministry** Alexander Rosenbaum stated that a Christmas event will be held November 18 at Rhodes Grove.
- **Finance** Dan Gehris shared that October undesignated giving was over budget. Operating expenses for October came in under budget. Giving has averaged above budget over the past year. We are very grateful for the generosity of those attending KSC. Brad Etchberger pre-

- sented the 2022 KSC Budget Proposal. After much discussion among the board members, the 2022 budget was approved.
- **Local Outreach** Sharon Bowers stated that Agape numbers are increasing. The meals that are being offered at RESET are having a positive impact.
- **Missions** Alyssa Heberlig shared that all missions gifts that were approved have been distributed. Communication is ongoing regarding a subcommittee of the Missions Co-Mission that would be focused on maintaining contact and assessing the needs in Haiti.
- **Personnel Relations** Kim Shatzer stated that Debbie Watson announced her retirement to be effective as of January 31, 2022.
- **Property** Dale Forney shared they are reviewing a plan to maximize funds for refurbishing the nursery. Building automation work starts in December. Security plans are being reviewed. The Decorating Committee is working with the Library Committee to plan a new layout. The middle school hallway will receive a refresh along with some improvements to closets in the SMC.
- **Student Ministry** Penny Poorman stated the "5th Quarter" event was great. The fall Street Ministry season will be closing out on December 1 with a Christmas party.
- Worship Arts Carolyn Chenaille shared that the "Thanks and Praise Hymn Sing" will be held November 21. The Christmas video has been completed and the Worship Team is preparing for holiday events.

New Message Series – Hebrews: Jesus Is Greater

I am so excited to begin 2022 with a Sunday sermon series in the Book of Hebrews! Several have asked me, "Why Hebrews?" I have several reasons. The first is that we've spent the past four months looking at the Old Testament Book of Isaiah. Every page of Isaiah looks FORWARD to the coming of Jesus, which is why the sermon series was titled, "Hope has a Name." Seven hundred years before Jesus came to this earth, Isaiah gave us prophecy after prophecy telling us EXACTLY what His coming would look like and why it had to be. The Book of Hebrews is, in many ways, the other "bookend" of the life of Christ. Isaiah looked FORWARD and predicted the coming of Christ—Hebrews LOOKS BACK on the life of Christ and explains with great clarity how Jesus perfectly fulfilled every single Old Testament prophecy.

Another reason to study Hebrews has to do with our desperate need for hope and assurance. This series is entitled "Jesus is Greater." Over and over again in Hebrews the author shows us how Jesus is better. He's better than angels. He's better than Moses. His blood is better than the blood of animals. He is a better high priest than any earthly priest. He's better than our fears, better than our doubts and better than all of our wildest expectations. If there has ever been a time to hear this message, that time is NOW!

Join me starting January 2 as we begin this exciting journey together!

from the OMM Leadership Team

OMM had its last quarterly distribution of 2021 on Saturday, December 11. The Lord blessed us from the forcasted rain as it held out until the distribution was done. It sounds like a small thing — rain. It's just weather after all. But we were concerned about the way it could potentially hinder us from being able to carry out our mission effectively. Come to think of it, since this outdoor, drive-through COVIDstyle distribution process started in September 2020, we haven't had rain to contend with ... not even once. That speaks of God's desire to pave the way ahead for His children as we carry out His mission — not OMM's specifically or exclusively, but anyone who is acting as the hands and feet of the Lord.

That certainly doesn't mean there won't be difficulties, rain being the least of those that mission workers of all kinds face, but it does mean He sees the obstacles ahead before we face them. He knows which ones to remove to prevent hindrances to His goals and which ones will allow us to grow in Him. Then He arranges events and people accordingly, with the ultimate good of those who love Him in the forefront. It takes very strategic maneuvering to place various people and events in the right places and orders to affect the "upper story" (as Pastor

Jody says) in a way that will have the impact that He desires. Obstacles and challenges, while they're not what we want, teach us to trust the Lord and His timing. Waiting is something a lot of us find difficult. We want answers to prayer now! We want healing now! We want resolution to problems now! But learning comes in the wait.

Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. James 1:2-6 (NIV)

Our Volunteers and Partners

OMM would like to thank our wonderful and dedicated volunteers and friends who donate supplies, time and effort for their faithfulness and love for our community! We are so blessed to have you and couldn't do it without you.

In addition to the 250 bags and boxes of toiletries supplied by King Street Church and its congregation members, the following individuals and businesses contributed the following supplies to make December's distribution more plentiful:

- Bender's Potato Farm: 280 ten-pound bags of potatoes
- David H. Martin Excavation: Trailer to

- store prepacked toiletry supply boxes and bags
- Gene and Fern Diller: 200 boxes to pack toiletries
- Ruthie Ludwig and Dollar Tree: 50 reusable grocery bags

The Numbers

On Thursday, December 9, 19 OMM packers packed 200 toiletry boxes and 50 bags and the Porch Ministry volunteers loaded them onto the trailer for Saturday's distribution.

On Saturday, December 11, from 9-12 p.m., 21 OMM volunteers distributed toiletries and food to 257 families, which translated to a total of 1,047 people reached!

The People

Our friends traveled from areas like Chambersburg, Mercersburg, Fayetteville and Shippensburg. Languages represented were as follows:

- 109 Spanish
- 89 English
- 59 Haitian/Creole

To compare those numbers with September's distribution, we had 130, 94 and 45, respectively, so we saw roughly a 30% increase in Haitian/Creole speakers and a decrease in Spanish and English speakers.

Christmas Extras

- Toothbrushes: We were thrilled to be able to offer toothbrushes for the December distribution as sort of a small Christmas bonus. The leadership's initial goal was to get 500 toothbrushes, or two per box or bag. Realizing we serve a BIG God, we challenged the congregation to double that number to 1000. The final count came in at 1060!
- Gift cards: The KSC leadership team wanted to bless our OMM's friends, so they asked the congregation to raise enough funds to bless 250 families with a \$10 Walmart gift card, or \$2500 total. Again, we serve a BIG

God, evidenced by the fact that \$3,250 was donated—enough for a \$13 gift card for 250 families, who were not aware of this Christmas extra. Gift cards will be mailed out with the normal post-distribution thank-you cards OMM volunteers personally write. We pray these gift cards bless our families!

Thank you, King Street Church congregation, for your steadfast support of OMM and our neighbors! We are humbled by your generosity, care for the community and reaching others for Christ!

Live out Jesus' golden rule by preparing gift bags for people in need.




What you need:

Update From Namikango Mission

November 24, 2021

Over the past few years but especially in 2021, there has been an unprecedented multiplication in the ministry at Namikango that has left us both in awe of God and in need of additional resources!

So, let's recount just what has happened ...

• God increased our Namikango staff from 50 to 80 Malawians in the last 10 years.



- 45 farmers were trained that have now trained over 900 farmers in their local communities.
- 30 women were trained in village savings and loan that have launched over 126 groups to help women make a sustainable living.

- Women's ministry was launched to teach biblical health lessons which created six groups with over 1,200 attending on a regular basis.
- New Discipleship Training Institute opened up with the first cohort to train leaders in new methodology in Malawi.

Just like the New Testament church experienced, multiplication and growth can be exciting and challenging. The continued expansion of ministry at Namikango has been exciting, but also challenging, partly coming from the



difficulties of our own world, but also directly because of the impact of the growth of work. As we work toward the vision of transforming African communities by training people and reaching the lost, mission operations increase along with the growth, which is a good problem to have.

You can be a big part of the increase as \$76,000 is needed to meet the growth demand to cover training and operations including the Discipleship Training Institute, \$35,000 for vehicles to help transport more mission supplies and \$100,000 to continue to guide children toward Jesus at Ntonda Primary School. Ntonda has undergone several devastating storms over the last four years and there is a need for a new school building and three homes for staff members. All of this so we can share Jesus and multiply the impact of disciple-making with children in Malawi.

(On a short term mission trip to ■)

It's so hard to believe that the school Christmas party was a week and a half ago! The day of the party was filled with games, songs, laughter, shenanigans and cookies! The students had so much fun and I had a great time interacting with my students outside of the formal classroom setting.

The party was a huge success all because of the Father's intervention throughout the entire process. My teammates and I have clearly seen Him working before, during and after the party! In more specific terms here are just a few of the ways we saw the Father working.

Before the Party

- Through your generosity: The party was just an idea in our minds until your support made it a reality. We originally had no money in our budget allotted for a party, so it was through all of you that this event happened! Through the funds we received from your generosity, my teammates and I were able to purchase supplies for cookie decorating, pay for a space to host the party, provide students with small goodie bags and provide lunch for school faculty and other volunteers.
- Through providing a space for the party: Our original plan was to have the party in a small restaurant on the grounds of Bronze Lake, but we later found out this space was already being occupied by other guests. For a few days it was questionable if we'd be able to have the party at all. The Father then provided us with the opportunity to have the party in a hotel across the street. We could use the conference room, outside space and a few smaller meeting rooms. This space worked so well for the party and was much better suited to our needs than the restaurant would have been. The Father knew of this need before we even realized it!

• Through providing volunteers: With all four grades combined, we have around 200 students ... and there are only four of us. There was no way my teammates and I would be able to manage such an event on our own! Thankfully, the Father provided the help we needed through city teammates traveling to the province to help us and through the school providing faculty volunteers. In total we had about 25 volunteers helping us with the party!

- Through high student attendance: So many students attended the party! There was some concern about how to communicate the party to students and wondering if they would even attend, but we had an incredible turnout!
- Through beautiful weather: Cool season came just in time for the party. It wasn't too hot and it wasn't rainy, so students could play outside and have more space for active games.
- Through collaboration with staff and KECC: Although the party originated as an idea presented by my teammates and me, the school was eager to join in and collaborate with us to make the party a success. It was really cool to see the school administration take some ownership of the party as well, so that it became a KECC party (welcoming and including everyone as a part of KECC) instead of just a party run by the

foreign teachers. The atmosphere of the party and the school's involvement have served to help build relationships with administration and bridge the gap between us and the school administrators.

After

- Through lunch with KECC faculty: After the party, we had lunch with school administration and faculty to spend time getting to know the other teachers and building a foundation for relationships with them. Our conversations over lunch can now be used as a starting point for deepening our relationships with them.
- Through KECC's interest in the party: Before the party even ended, school staff were making plans with us regarding next year's Christmas party and have made it very clear they want the party to be an annual tradition! One of the staff members (known for her skepticism of those who are not likeminded) even suggested that we have a pageant next year where the students reenact the birth of the Son!
- Through building relationships with people at the party: The party allowed my teammates and me to build relationships with many different people including our students, parents and school faculty. Through these blossoming relationships, my teammates and I hope to continue to grow the connections we made at the party and are asking the Father to help us be intentional in our interactions with the people we met at the party. Thank you all so much for your support and interest in KECC and the things the Father is doing in ■!
