A Passion for God's People

God has a plan to bring hope and salvation to every person on the globe. No kidding. Every single person. The struggling single mom raising a young child living on the ninth floor of a high rise apartment building on the outskirts of Shanghai. The ailing older man scraping by in a dirt-floor hut in central Africa. The angry thirteen-year-old young woman fighting loneliness and despair in downtown Detroit. The twenty-something couple in Mexico City working twelve hour days and carrying the fear that the pain in the young husband's side might be some kind of cancer.

God uniquely created each of these people. He knit them together while still in their mother's womb. He gave each of them specific talents and personality traits. He sees them as precious and dearly loved. And He is divinely orchestrating circumstances and relationships so that each and every one of these people will have the opportunity to hear the good news that God loves them—that He sent His only son, Jesus, to die on the cross to forgive their sins and to open the door for them to live an abundant life of Spirit-filled freedom and joy while eagerly awaiting His return to this earth to take us home to be with Him forever in heaven.

So how, exactly, is God doing this? The answer is: the church. The People of God. The Body of Christ. The Bride of Christ. The hands and feet of Jesus. Me and you.

In Matthew chapter 16, Jesus asked His disciples that they believed about Him... who did they think that He was. Did they think that He

was simply a good teacher? Or did they believe that He was the Son of God who came from heaven to rescue the world from sin? Simon Peter spoke up and said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, from now on you will be called Peter ("the Rock!"), and on this rock (your faith) I will build my church, and the gates of hell will not prevail against it."

Did you catch that last sentence? For the past 2,000 years Jesus has been building His church around the world (which includes us here at King Street). What started as a dozen average, ordinary men and a handful of other followers—has expanded to include millions and millions of people in some of the deepest, darkest corners of this globe who have put their faith in Jesus (just like Peter!), believing that He is the Son of God and rescuer of our souls.

Beginning in August (lasting until Thanksgiving), I will be preaching a sermon series out of the books of 1st and 2nd Corinthians. I've decided to entitle this series: "A Passion for God's People." What we see in these two books (actually, letters) is the Apostle Paul writing to a brand new church—only a few years old—that God had used him to start. Some historical perspective on this is really helpful. Jesus had told Peter that He was going to "build His church" in an area just north of the Sea of Galilee right around the year 30 AD. Just twenty years later, the

Apostle Paul planted a church well over 1,000 miles away from Galilee in one of the most prominent and metropolitan cities in the entire Roman Empire (I often think of Corinth as an ancient Las Vegas). Please don't miss how significant this is. In the span of a few short years, the words of Jesus are already becoming a reality IN A SIGNIFICANT WAY. There were now people in Corinth whose lives were being transformed by the Spirit of Christ as Jesus was beginning to build His church.

But don't think for a second that this was going to be easy or without struggle. Satan is trembling in his boots, and he is going to use every obstacle and trick at his disposal to thwart the work of God in this world (think "gates of hell"). Paul—who a few years later is now planting another church in the city of Ephesus—receives reports of some of the struggles that this young church in Corinth is experiencing. Struggles that are threatening to divide and shut down the church. It is right in the midst of these conflicts that Paul writes these two letters that we now have in our Bible. What Satan meant for evil (shutting down the church), God used for good (the two letters we now have in our Bible).


What I don't want us to miss, though, is the much bigger story that is unfolding. The city of Corinth was full of hurting people who needed to hear about Jesus and experience the abundant life that He came to bring. God—in doing what only HE can do (and is still doing!)—sent the Apostle Paul to that city to establish a body of believers who would then

begin sharing the Gospel with their family and friends. Yes, Paul has an obvious passion for the people of God (as we'll see as we study 1st and 2nd Corinthians). But God's passion is far greater. And the reason is His passion for lost and hurting people.

Which brings us back to the struggling single mom in Shanghai, or the ailing man in central Africa, or the thirteenyear-old lonely teenager in Detroit. To this very day Jesus is building His church in all of these places in ways far far beyond anything we can see. God is using His people in these places to shine the light of the Gospel into the darkness. This week my son and daughter-in-law are headed to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia for a week of ministry with hurting families. Why? Because God has a passion for the people that they will be ministering to, and Jesus is mobilizing His Church to reach lost people. It was true in Corinth 2,000 years ago, and it's true today all around the globe. Thanks be to God!

Two Weeks of Serving with Our Students!

July 10-15 our students served all over our community with our annual ministry opportunity, Chambersburg Project. The following week they headed to Mayfield, Kentucky, to assist families who were affected by devastating tornadoes last December.

Chambersburg Project is an annual tradition for KSC; we have partnered with other local churches for 22 years to renovate and repair homes for Franklin County residents in need.



Installing a wheelchair ramp and repairing a rotting roof are only part of the dividends of a missions project like this one. More important are the contacts that the students make with the homeowners, the moments where they share <u>why</u> they are on their knees in their flower gardens and climbing ladders in the sun. We pray that the message is clear: that we follow Jesus and His selfless, counter-cultural example: "...the Son of Man did not come to be served, **but to serve**, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45)



When the team of 13 students/leaders was in Kentucky, Pastor Matt sent this update:

"The Kentucky Mission team has been hard at work in the heat. On Monday we stacked over 500 cinder blocks and cleaned up tornado debris in Mayfield. The last two days we have been working on repairing a roof and replacing a floor. Everyone is doing well and working hard!"

June Board Highlights

The Board of Administration of King Street Church met Wednesday, June 8, 2022 in the Choir Room. Glenn Watson, Chairman of the Board of Administration, called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

SENIOR PASTOR REPORT

Pastor Jody shared that we have had some unique services these past several Sundays including our 2nd annual outdoor service, our lament service and we also had Pastor Rob's sermon message this past Sunday. Pastor Jody also shared a review on his objectives for the 2021/2022 ministry year. There was good discussion on the vision for KSC and how the pastors, elders and co-missions are engaged/ involved.

EXECUTIVE PASTOR REPORT

Pastor Steve shared that on June 19 we will have three child dedications in the Baker Center and three in the Sanctuary. On June 26, we will have a baptism service for two young people. On Monday at the Staff Meeting, we welcomed three new people: Xavier Schell is our Prime Intern from Huntington University serving in Student Ministry, along with Blake Rhoades and Anna Shaffer who are our new interns serving with Tyler Roberts in our Media & Production 10 Department.

ELDERS TEAM REPORT

Greg West shared that the elders met last month and they are working on a variety of topics. The elders are engaged in the vision of KSC, prayer requests, conflict resolution, Bible Study, participating in baptisms, reviewing partnership applications and teaching in partnership classes.

CO-MISSION REPORTS (alpha order)

Adult Ministry – Tim Sherald reported the Adult Ministry Co-Mission met on May 18th as the first of two annual L3 group meetings. We have two new L3 groups. Pastor Jay Brown reported that The Porch (young adults group) is going strong. Pastor Jay also reported there was good attendance at the new Bible Study class that began this past week. A motion was passed by the co-mission to sponsor a King Street Church family to be able to attend the KSConnectABILITY Summer Family Camp.

Children's Ministry – Alexander

Rosenbaum shared the children's ministry staff is very busy and focused on VBS right now. VBS is scheduled for July 26-29. All teacher positions have been filled and now they are just filling in helpers where needed. The co-mission is requesting prayer for a very successful VBS this year.

Finance – Brad Etchberger shared that our goal is to balance the church annual budget over the next two years. Dan Gehris shared his financial report on May 2022 final results and YTD figures. In summary, undesignated giving in May 2022 was under budget, YTD undesignated giving is under budget, expenses in May were under budget, YTD expenses are under budget. We deeply appreciate the financial gifts that are given each month to support the Lord's ministry here at King Street Church.

Local Outreach – Sharon Bowers advised the LOC held their quarterly partnership meeting. Sharon shared with the board the incredible growth of the Agape English Program and read an email from Adam Keath regarding Sue Marshall applying for a \$25,000 grant for an additional 17 computers in the Ministry Center. The grant would also provide for 40 additional Rosetta Stone subscriptions. The Agape English Program has been growing exponentially this academic year and we praise God for this.

Missions – Alyssa Heberlig shared that the Cool Shade of Life Church in Thailand is resuming evangelism trips to the region of Isaan. A missionary pilot with Mission Aviation Fellowship will be at KSC on Friday, June 17th at 6:00pm. Alyssa shared the hope of expanding the sponsorship of students in Arcahaie, Haiti through CH Global. A time to share about child sponsorship in Haiti will be planned for a Sunday morning in August or September here at KSC.

Personnel Relations – Aaron Smith shared that he speaks to Pastor Steve weekly about PRC related topics and it has been a blessing to work and collaborate together. Two things being worked on right now are job descriptions and updating some of our policies, including employment background checks and social media guidelines.

Property – Dale Forney advised the Property Co-Mission is working with Pastor Steve on the Décor Committee Policy draft and they are soliciting for additional members for the Décor Committee. The Library Project is ongoing. The middle school project is in the process of defining the scope of the work to be completed, including flooring and painting. The staff provided a draft version of the KSC Security Plan for review. The next Property Co-Mission meeting will be on August 1.

Student Ministry – Penny Poorman shared the first summer Street Meeting is June 8 and Xavier Schell, our Prime Intern, will be starting a series focused on "Reset – Reconnecting with God". Upcoming events include Summer Sneak on June 14-18 at Cape Henlopen, July 10-15 is an outreach for students in grades 6-12 to work on projects at homes of local residents and then July 17-23 will be a trip to Western Kentucky for students in grades 9-12 to assist with tornado recovery.

Worship Arts – Andrea Mowen advised the Worship Arts Co-Mission did not meet in June and will not be meeting in July either. They are continuing to pray over all the different ministries in each service.

Alexander Rosenbaum closed the meeting in prayer at 9:16pm.

Prayer Requests

With that said, we would like to ask for your prayers and help. We know the Lord will meet our needs, and you might just be part of His plan!

Some slow moving and some really fast, but there's so much to learn in the midst of it (read more about my thoughts on transition at the end).

As you can see, I've been keeping busy around our house! It feels like there's always another project to be done and more of the yard to clean up. Most of my spare time is spent outside (when it's not blazing hot) to work on different things. I've had a few people ask me why I'm putting so much work into a place I'm only renting. But it's more than that. I've read my Bible, I know that if I'm faithful with what I have now I will be entrusted with more later. And I don't only mean being entrusted with more here in this life. I believe it's here in this life and in the age to come. I have a friend who says that our life here on earth is like a 90-year internship training us for life in the Kingdom. What we do with what we have now matters. We see examples in scripture where Jesus talks about heavenly rewards and the fact that He doesn't miss anything— He even remembers when we give someone a cup of cold water.

Not every season of my life has been like this; usually they're fast paced and I'm longing for a break. Would I love to be living somewhere in the nations? Yeah, I'd love to be back overseas. Do I think I'll go eventually? Yes. In the meantime, I can be content and appreciate the season the Lord has me in, knowing I'm walking in obedience and playing the part He's asked me to play. I really am enjoying this season & the Lord is so kind.

Thank you all so much for continuing to pray for me as I've navigated this transition. There have definitely been some really hard, really lonely times. But I am so thankful to be covered in prayer and encouraged by so many people. I say this all the time, but I really could not be doing what I'm doing without all of you.
