Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

- If your family had a theme song, what would it be? Why that song?
- How many relatives can you list? (Don't know many relatives? List friends who are like family to you!)
- What helps us stay close as a family?
- What might help our family stay close to other members of God's family?





It's time to work together! As a family, brainstorm tasks around the home each of you usually does alone, such as making your bed, folding laundry, or picking up toys. Then choose a couple tasks that need to be done and do them together. Turn drudgery into fun by playing music, singing, dancing, and enjoying each other's company!

Say: The Bible says the Holy Spirit makes us one family—God's family! And just like when we work together as a family, getting things done and having fun, when we work with other members of God's family, amazing things happen. We can worship God together, serve together, and follow God together!





I Can Read Your Mind

You live with these people ... eat with these people ... share a bathroom with these people. But how well do you really know your family? It's time to find out!

Take turns predicting how family members will answer the following questions. See who in your family seems to know the others best.

What is your favorite ice cream flavor? Favorite spot in your home? Least favorite household task? Favorite time of day? Preferred pizza topping? Favorite vegetable? Favorite sport team? Favorite number? Favorite way to eat eggs? Your shoe size?

Say: We don't always know what other people think or feel—even if we know those people well. There's always more to learn about our family members, and that's true for our earthly family and the family of God. The Holy Spirit brings all Jesus-followers into God's family, so we've got a whole lot of people to get to know better!
