#### King Street Is a Teaching Church

Aaron Perry, Senior Pastor

Who taught you how to throw a football, sew a button, play an instrument, cook a steak, bake a pie, read a book, perform two-digit multiplication, or work a computer? When you think about all the things you can do, you likely had many teachers. What made the good teachers really good? I grew up around teachers. I admire really good teachers. The best teachers know their subjects, refine their skills, care about their students, and can actually get the subjects into the brains and their skills into the bodies of their students. Good teachers must actually teach.

When a wealthy man was drawn to Jesus for answers to life's biggest question, he called Jesus "Teacher" (Mark 10:17). This was a common title for Jesus and it was an honorable one. To be a teacher was not only to be in a position of authority, but to wield authority in action. Teachers taught truth. Just like the string gives force for an arrow to go in a direction, so teachers empower students to go in a direction.

#### A TEACHING CHURCH

The bow is in authority over the arrow; the truth in the teacher's mouth has authority over the learner. When the man rejected Jesus's direction, he rejected Jesus' authority. But Jesus is not simply a teacher; He is The Teacher. In the ancient story of Job, it is asked, "Who is a teacher like God? Who has prescribed his ways?" (Job 36:22b-23a). If we reject Jesus' ways, we are going the wrong way. We have nothing to teach God; we need the Good Teacher.

When I was interviewing for the position of Senior Pastor at King Street Church, I was impressed at the culture of discipleship. There were various kinds of small groups, decadesold Sunday School classes, a rich history of preaching, and well-established curriculum. The Agape English Ministry resonated deeply with me. One gentleman told me how his grandfather had taught him at King Street Church and now he's teaching his grandchildren. What a rich history of teaching! I knew that being a teaching church was not just King Street's past and present, but must be a defining aspect of its future.

King Street Church will be a teaching church only as we follow and learn from The Teacher. We will passionately and purposefully follow Jesus Christ. Our pastors, staff, Sunday School teachers, and small group leaders will all continue to seek Christ and to know Him personally. We cannot teach Christ if we do not know Christ. There is a big difference between knowing about Jesus and knowing Jesus. Likewise, there is a big difference between teaching about Jesus and teaching Jesus. We will continue to know Christ so that

we may teach Christ. We follow Christ, the Word of God made flesh, by studying and applying the Written Word by the power of the Spirit.

King Street Church will be a teaching church by continuing to be a model for other churches. Churches are unique, having different histories, people, passions, and knowledge. While churches might serve the same Lord, they have different skills and knowledge bases. Just like the best teachers know their subjects and their skills, King Street Church wants to be a teaching church from whom other churches may learn because we know our subject and skills well in our own unique way. We will be passionate about learning, being willing to adapt our ministry practices to be more effective for Christ's mission.

King Street Church will be a teaching church by creating different environments where the Gospel of Jesus Christ can be worked into the details of our church family. While the preaching of the Word of God on Sunday morning will continue to be vital, the details of the Word often take community, curriculum, and personal care for lifelong application. The full good news of the Gospel is often worked into the details of our lives in smaller communities. The Gospel of Jesus is practical it makes a difference in our daily lives. King Street Church will provide relevant and practical teaching for our people to live out the Gospel in their personal lives on Sunday morning and in environments through the week.

King Street Church will be a teaching church as we grow more teachers. And do you know

who is responsible for teaching the Christian faith? You are. You will teach the Christian faith by your words, your deeds, and the overall shape of your life. We do this teaching work together as we live out and speak out our faith. King Street Church has been, is, and will be a teaching church—and you're part of the teaching team. We will also call out people who have a gift of teaching. God has consistently raised up young people to learn, guard, and teach the faith. King Street Church will support the training of those God is raising up as teachers.

Let me confess something: I'm not most interested in who taught you how to throw a football, sew a button, or bake a pie. I am interested in who taught you about Christ. Who taught you the story of the Christian faith? Who taught you the skills of Christ's disciples? Who taught you to stay in step with the Holy Spirit? But even more, I'm interested in who is teaching you. The question is not whether or not we're being taught, but what we're being taught and by whom. If you spend an hour a day on Instagram, Fox News, or MSNBC, you're being taught. Any of these



### Orphan's Tree

#### From Megan Fogelsanger:

Central Asia was my first missions trip, and because of that, I don't think I ever would have accurately predicted the impact it would have on my life. We spent a lot of time hearing the stories of the orphan grads. Some told us what their childhood was like,

others told us what they were struggling with now as adults. One young woman told us how she, with her older brother, provided for her two younger sisters when she was just 9 years old. She made sure they all had food to eat and that they made it to school each day. She did this well enough that it took months before anyone realized the children were on their own. I can say with absolute certainty that I could not have done what she did at 9 years old.

Hearing her story and just being with the orphan grads really shifted the focus in my heart because there are so many who have similar stories all around us. It has given me a refreshed sense of gratitude for the life I've been given, and reminded me of the importance of sharing my faith. I've spent so much time focusing on my personal relationship with God and thought that I needed to have all of that under control before I could fully focus on others. But I feel that is what God wanted me to take away from this trip. He wanted to show me that through Him I can help others and serve others and comfort others. There are no skills that I need to learn or develop before God can use me; He will meet me where I am and walk with me through this journey. I just need to depend on Him. It doesn't matter if I'm in my community or halfway around the world- "Here am I, send me."







#### **September Highlights**

The Board of Administration of King Street Church met on Monday, September 15.

#### **Senior Pastor Report** (Pastor Aaron

Perry) – In the past two months Pastor Aaron has worked to identify and communicate King Street Church's identity, nature and emerging vision to staff, elders and to the Board of Admin. **New Business** – Pastor Aaron presented the Strategic Ministry Plan. The main themes were to align KSC's three significant leadership teams (staff, elders and board), to unify the staff and pastors as one ministry team leading the people of KSC in ministry, to build toward a comprehensive ministry pathway and to attend to King Street Church's financial habits and culture.

### **Engaging & Blessing** OUR COMMUNITY WITH THE GOSPEL

#### **Serve Our Community!**

Nearly 15 years ago, the late Gary Porter approached John Comerer in their Sunday School class, and invited him to see God's work at the Cold Weather Drop-In Shelter. This ministry of KSC — where we serve every Wednesday night during the winter months — was initiated by Gary and he served regularly until he passed away in December 2021.

John says, "Gary was an innovator. He saw a need and he jumped on it. The Cold Weather Shelter became one of his personal passions."

Gary often asked his fellow attendees at King Street to accompany him. For John Comerer, it was an easy yes.

Upon his first visit, John says, "I definitely saw a need. I saw that there are many people in Chambersburg that are homeless and need help."

John describes that in the winter months, the help that the shelter offers is life-sustaining. He explains, "They don't have the money to pay for rent, and some struggle with mental illness. At the shelter, they get a free meal and a warm place to sleep."

John claimed the torch of responsibility from Gary. He now manages this ministry, on behalf of King Street Church, from December through March, which includes these duties:

- 1. Meals: He asks Sunday School classes to deliver a meal each Wednesday night at 7pm. This is also a great opportunity for friend groups, Bible studies, and L3s.
- 2. Guest Oversight: John offers the meal for the guests to eat, helps clean up afterwards, and provides general oversight until midnight. He provides general care, answers questions, welcomes guests, and calls for medical help if someone is ill.

PLEASE HELP: John needs other men to assist him in this task. It is ideal if one person

can serve from 7-9:30, and then another from 9:30midnight. (The shelter has a staff person who sleeps overnight). If you can provide a meal, or help John on Wednesday nights, please email him at jcomerer@comcast.net.

#### **Heading Overseas**

I am so excited to be heading back to England for the month of January! If you've been around here for a while, you might remember that I spent a couple of years doing university campus ministry all over the United Kingdom with Circuit Riders in 2019 and 2020. I fell in love with the nation, the people, and felt so privileged to see first hand how God is



moving there. I have a dear friend that I lived with in New Zealand who is on staff at a local church in England with the vision to bring healing, wholeness

and freedom to broken lives and communities, helping people on the journey of loving, trusting and following Jesus.

Weekly activities include children & youth groups, messy church (outreach to young families), discipleship groups, young adults ministry, Sunday gatherings and worship events.

In addition to the church, there is also a community project run in partnership with the church that serves as a food bank distribution centre and community cafe. It exists to provide practical support and a place of connection for those facing hardship in the local community. They engage with people from all walks of life–from homeless communities to refugees to single parent families to those in debt and many more. I am so excited to be welcomed in and able to serve in these areas for the month of January.

#### Day by Day

If I'm being honest, these past few months have been the hardest I've had to walk through in a long time. I have been walking through a lot of loss, grief, and disappointment. There is so much that's happened in my life in recent months that I can't change or control and so much I don't understand. As I continue to go through my day to day of work, classes, preparing for England, spending time with friends and community, I find that even in moments that I try to be happy and excited, I feel like I'm still carrying this undercurrent of grief and sadness. Please pray for endurance, healing, strength, and comfort.

This past Sunday was our church's annual Global Impact Sunday. This is a day each year that our church highlights the missions work around the world that the Christian & Missionary Alliance is doing. (This is the denomination of my church here in Kentucky). One thing I have always appreciated about the Alliance's approach to global missions is that 80% of their international workers live in the most unreached areas in the world, where people have little to no chance of knowing Jesus.

As I listened to all of the stories and testimonies of what the Lord has been doing globally this past year, I found myself thinking that more than ever, I remember that I am a missionary– through and through. From the time I first felt called when I was 15 and every big and little moment since then. In recent weeks I have been thinking and praying about 2026 and considering opportunities and open doors for me to go back overseas for other short/mid term trips. I would love your prayers as I continue to seek His guidance for 2026.

Also I want to apologize for the amount of time it's taken to send another update! The more time that passes, the harder it is to fit everything into one update!

As you saw in my last update, I have started coaching in a refugee camp. The ground is super bumpy, the grass was uneven, and the net was old and needing replaced. It would have been very easy to twist an ankle. So, it was decided that the court would be fixed with sand and the net would be replaced. SO, with your support, we were able to help with the cost of the court and net. Through this, the volleyball project has grown exponentially! We went from 12 people in the first couple of weeks to 39 people the past couple of weeks, ages 14-24, with some helpers that are a little too young to play. I've seen the players get better at volleyball, but I've also seen myself get better at communicating as well. The players that have been with me since the beginning are much more comfortable with me now and even help me communicate when I'm floundering in my language. Think of this project as your project as well. Thank you so much for your support.

Now for what the Lord has been teaching me lately. As I was on my short little trip through

Europe with a friend (I'll talk more about that later in this letter), I was talking with said friend about FOMO (Fear of missing out). We were discussing how it has affected our lives. As we were talking, I realized that there's another acronym that fits me well as well: FODP (fear of disappointing people). This revelation helped me realize that I have let the fear of man control my behavior so many times in the past. Whether that means being worried about what someone will say about me, fearing to confront someone, or just plain saying *no* is hard sometimes.

Galatians talks about this exact point in chapter one verse ten when it says, "Am I now trying to win the approval of human beings, or of God? Or am I trying to please people? If I were still trying to please people, I would not be a servant of Christ." Oh how often do I live for the approval of man and not the Lord. Pray that we may live lives as servants, not of humans, but of the One Most High.

#### **Biking Friends**

One of the new ways that I have found good exercise and bonding with good friends is through biking together. I've been on several bike rides, and I haven't even fallen yet! It has been a joy to start doing more exercise and has helped a lot mentally and spiritually.

#### **Body Building Competition**

This past month I've worked out so much that I entered into a body building competition... I'm just kidding but I did have the unique opportunity to attend a local body building competition. My language helper has been working over the past year to get his body to a point that he could do well at a body building competition and he was finally ready to enter one. It was a ton of fun for me to come support

him and it really meant a lot to him and our friendship. It was also fun meeting all of his other friends and being the only foreigner there.

I would love to share about my recent travels! I took a quick week long trip with my good friend Benni around a few countries in Europe. We went through Germany, France, Switzerland, Liechtenstein (which was one of the best), and Austria. The Lord had given multiple opportunities to pray for people as well as share truth with many. It was amazing seeing the areas that my friend grew up in and meet many of his childhood friends. I'm grateful for the time that we got to share together as he is moving back to Germany this summer.

One final thing; within the last few months I had the privilege to join my church in a short term trip to Mexico and then take a trip to Sweden and Denmark. I am so grateful for this opportunity for so many reasons. One, it was amazing to be back with so many of my brothers and sisters from church; both my Mexican family and American family. It was very encouraging to be around so many believers and to see the Good News shared with people coming to faith! It was truly amazing and am super glad I was able to be there with everyone. I am so thankful for the team. Every one of you encouraged me and impacted me in more ways than you can imagine.

the training. Among them this time we had a very happy Quechua Indian man from Peru (who kept us laughing), a Costa Rican missionary who works with Indian groups in Peru, and a Venezuelan young woman. They serve the Lord under difficult circumstances and it is a privilege in turn to serve them.

And now...I have an opportunity to be more blessed! An in-person workshop from October 20-29. Tomorrow, I travel first by land 7 hours away, then spend a few hours in a hotel and be at the

airport a little past midnight for my flight to Cali, Colombia. There I will be met by our team of 4 others—one coming form Peru, one from Venezuela and 2 others from other parts of Colombia. We have been in communication organizing this great event, over the last few months. Three different Indian groups of 4 in each group, have already been translating the Trauma Healing materials to their language-- all done orally.

We will be checking their recordings to see if they have captured the goals for each lesson and then a more professional recording will be produced. Another part of our task will be to take them through the training so that they in turn can set up and facilitate Healing Groups in their own language. Eventually, they will train their own people.

Pray for each team as they travel by land and/or by river to arrive at the retreat center. One of the key pastors, Ramiro, has had to hospitalize his father. Pray for quick recovery so that Ramiro will be able to travel.

The Lord has been impressing this verse on my mind recently. I am taking it as His promise to me. "Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, Yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.' Isaiah 41:10
